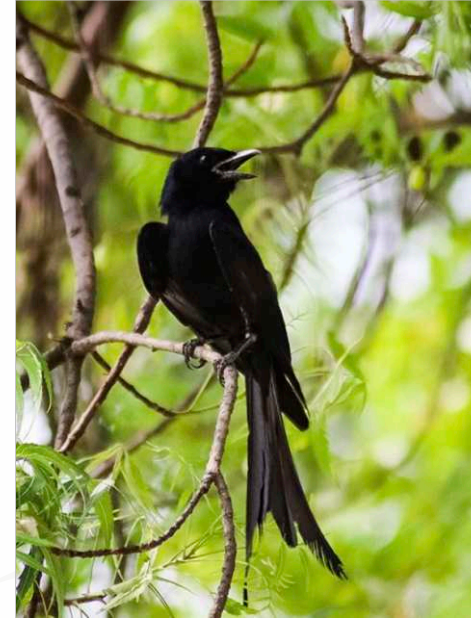

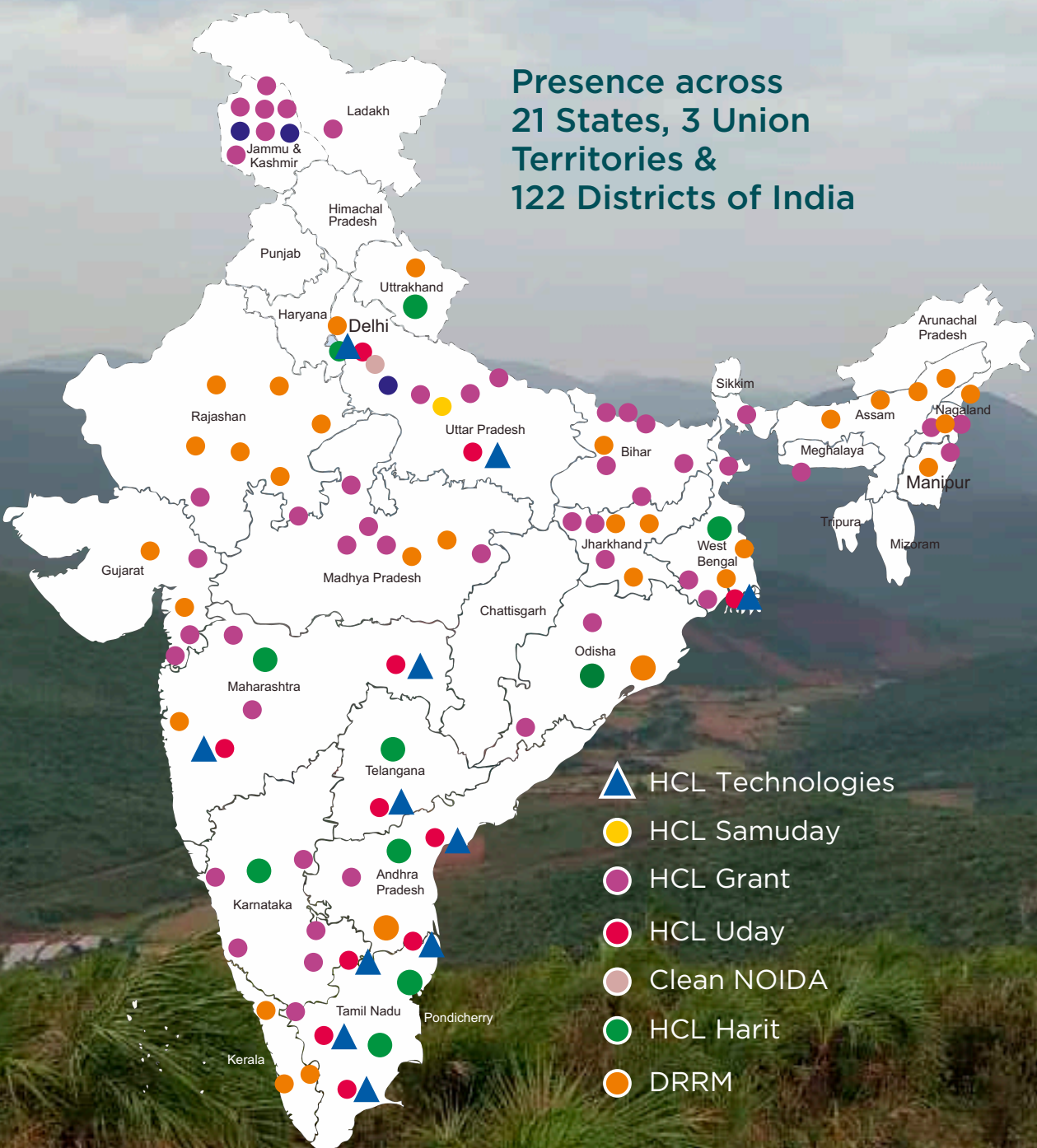

A DECADE OF STEWARDSHIP & IMPACT

On 1 July 2011, the passion, zeal and untiring efforts of HCLites to change the world, switched orbit and culminated into establishment of the CSR arm of HCL Technologies, the HCL Foundation. The Foundation set an ambitious course – to create source codes for holistic inclusive development. 10 years later – the flames of change are lighting lives in 21 states and three union territories.

Backed by a cumulative investment of ₹680 Cr (~\$93 Mn), 21 MoUs with Government agencies, partnerships with over 200 NGOs and more than 656,000+ volunteering hours clocked by HCLites, our programmes are reaching 2.14 Mn people with innovative developmental solutions that empower them to realise their rights. Through environment initiatives, we have planted over 540,000 saplings and sequestered ~200,000 kgs of CO₂. It's a growth driven by a deep resolve – to leave no one behind.

We owe this growth to a visionary leadership, rigorous governance, solid value driven partnerships, a dream team and the love and trust of the communities we work with.

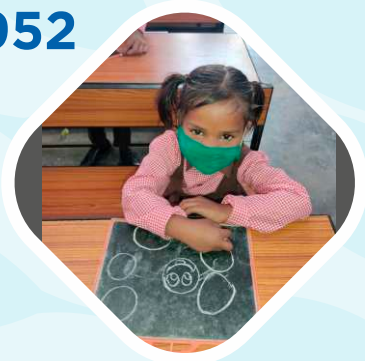

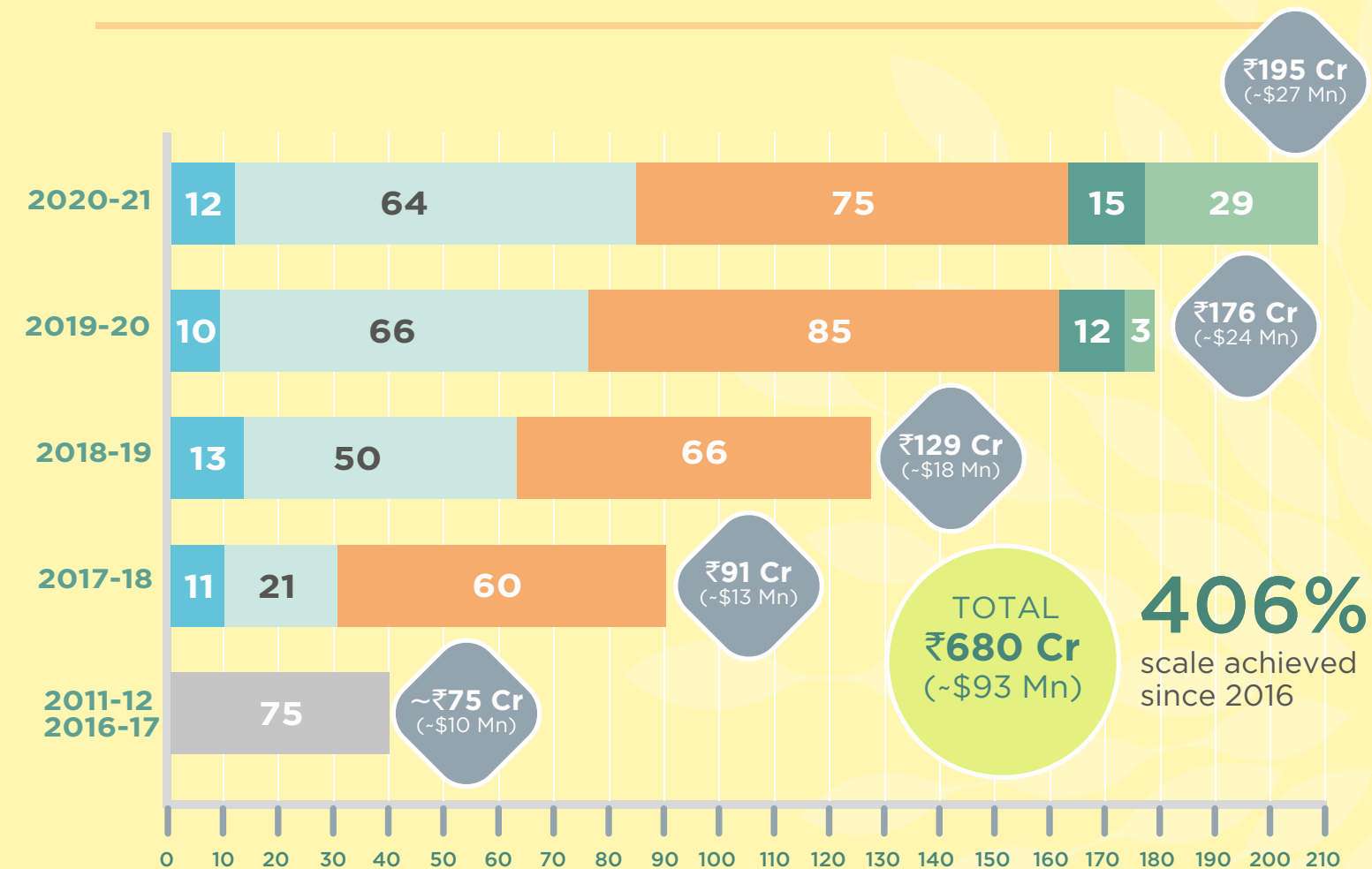

HCL FOUNDATION'S* SPENDING UNDER CSR** FY 2011-12 TO FY 2020-21 (₹Cr/\$Mn)



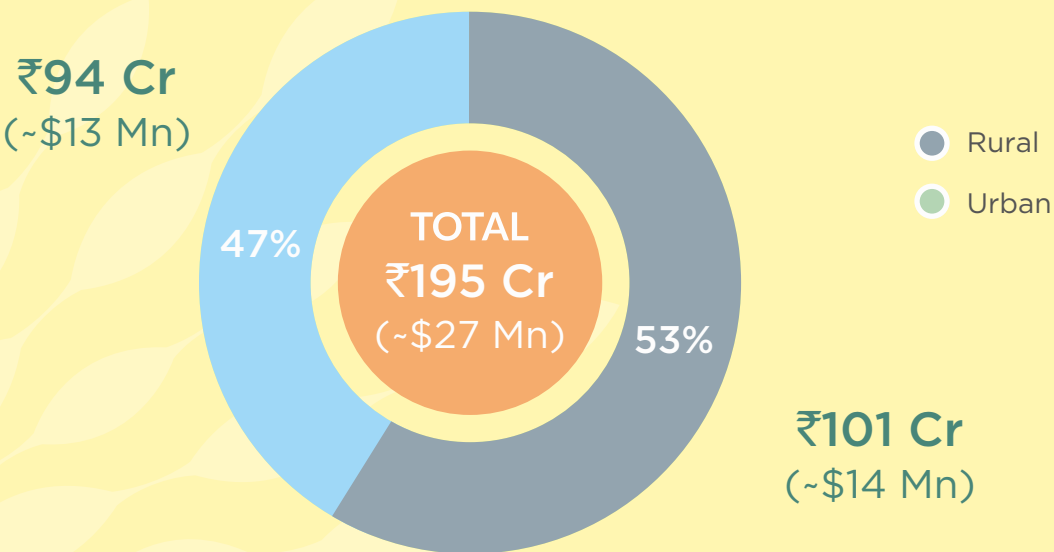

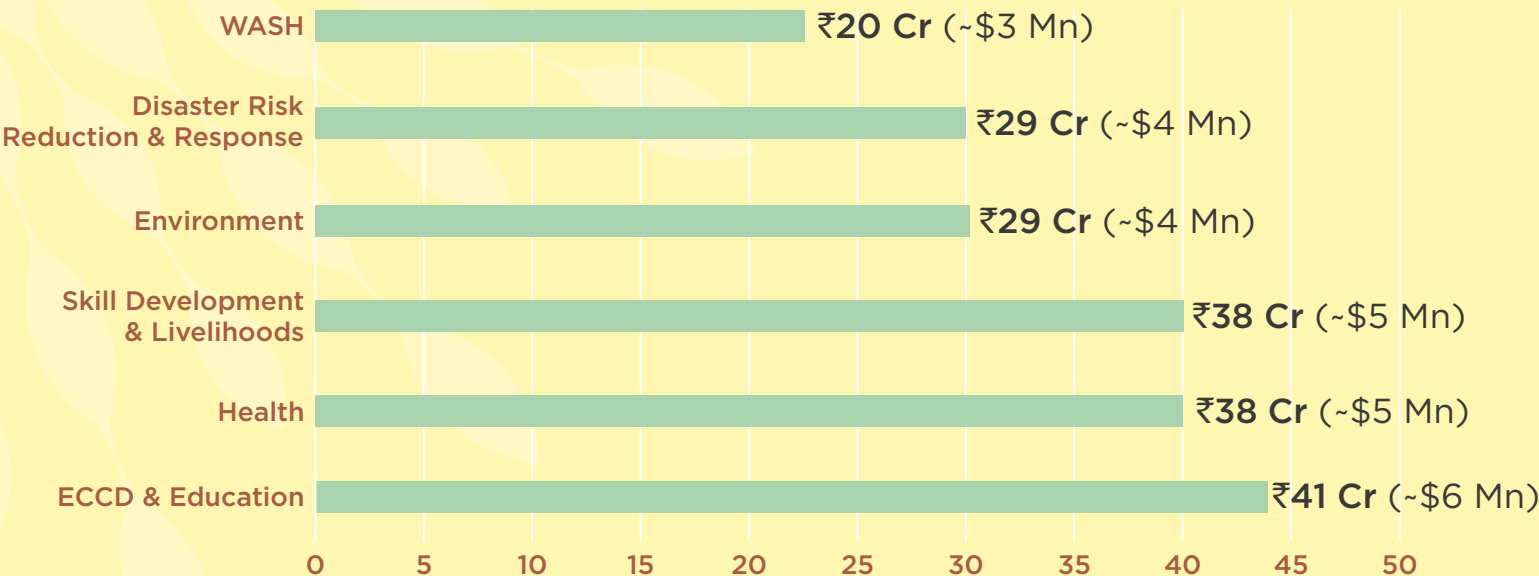

CSR EXPENDITURE (FY 2020-21) THEMATIC AREAS (₹Cr/\$Mn)





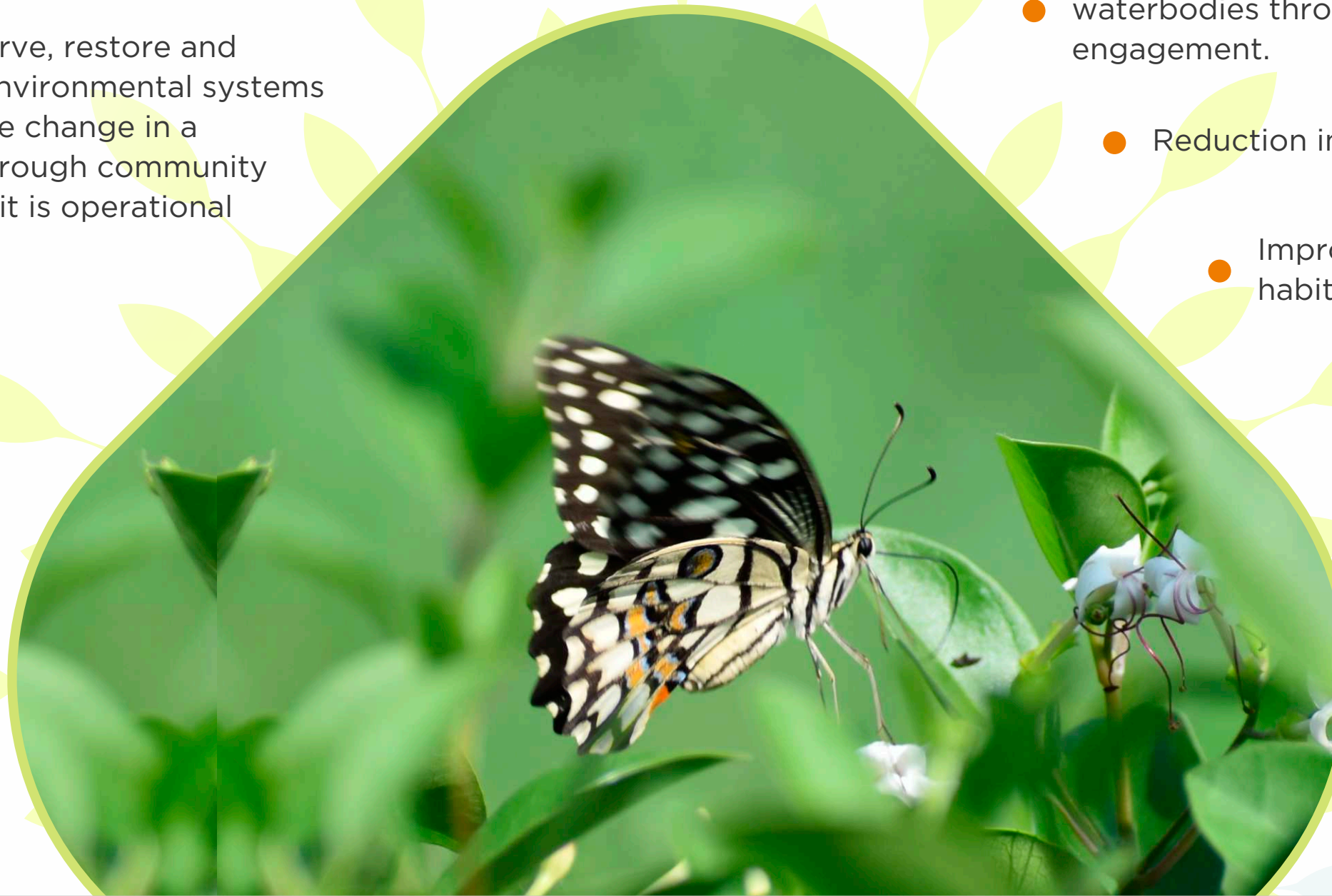
HCL HARIT

Stepping up its response to the rapidly unfolding climate crisis, HCL Foundation launched HCL Harit – The Green Initiative, a distinct flagship programme for Environment Action.

With the aim to conserve, restore and enhance indigenous environmental systems and respond to climate change in a sustainable manner through community engagement, HCL Harit is operational in nine states.

HCL HARIT FOCUSES ON:

- Increasing green cover, carbon sequestration, native biodiversity through afforestation and habitat improvement.
- Conservation and rejuvenation of waterbodies through community engagement.
- Reduction in CO₂ emissions.
- Improvement of coastal and marine habitats for native biodiversity.
- Improving lives of stray animals and addressing human animal conflict.
- Enhancing environment awareness among communities through environment education.

THE GREAT BEACH CLEAN-UP!

‘Revive Chennai’s Coast’ campaign.

Once famous for its cleanliness, a 5 km stretch of beach in Chennai was a favourite with tourists and locals alike. Economic activity boomed along the beachfront. As its popularity soared, the pollution and filth grew, posing a threat to an already endangered marine life.

Partners: Greater Chennai Corporation (GCC) and Environmentalist Foundation of India (E.F.I)

LEADERSHIP AT THE LAST MILE

Our Rural Initiatives

HCL Samuday & HCL Grant



HCL SAMUDAY

Creating a source code for rural development, HCL Samuday is working to uplift and secure last mile communities.

Launched in 2015, in one administrative block of U.P's Hardoi district, HCL Samuday has scaled to 11 blocks, reaching 871,000+ people with critical services in health, education, agriculture, livelihoods, clean energy, water and sanitation.

Driven by data and evidence, Samuday is ramping up its efforts while deepening its impact on the ground. With innovation as its hallmark, it has set in motion the continuous cycle of testing, evaluating, refining, enriching and scaling its strategy and strengthening its source code.



IMPACT AT A GLANCE (2015-2021)

- 72% pregnant women underwent minimum 3 ANC's and 87% institutional deliveries achieved, across 164 *Gram Panchayats**.
- The livelihoods initiative of dairy farming reported revenues of ₹75.8 Cr since 2015.
- The artisans collective led by rural women reached a revenue of ₹2 Cr since 2015.
- 164 *Gram Panchayats** made Open Defecation Free.
- Literacy rate increased from 57% to 70% across three administrative blocks.

*Gram panchayat is a Hindi word.
It means village level rural governance systems.*

Kiran, from a village in Uttar Pradesh, was a homemaker and mother of five. She often wished to support her family income. After a series of livelihoods based trainings, she took a loan of ₹20,000 from her SHG to start a poultry business and fulfil her dream.



She reared 1,110 poultry birds, generating a remarkable revenue of ₹1,62,000.



Her pair of two donated goats grew to a herd of six, netting an income of ₹50,000.



Today, Kiran is an intrepid business woman, the office bearer of the village organization - '*Shakti Prerna Mahila Gram Sangathan*'



She runs the Community Health Center helping other women become self-reliant.

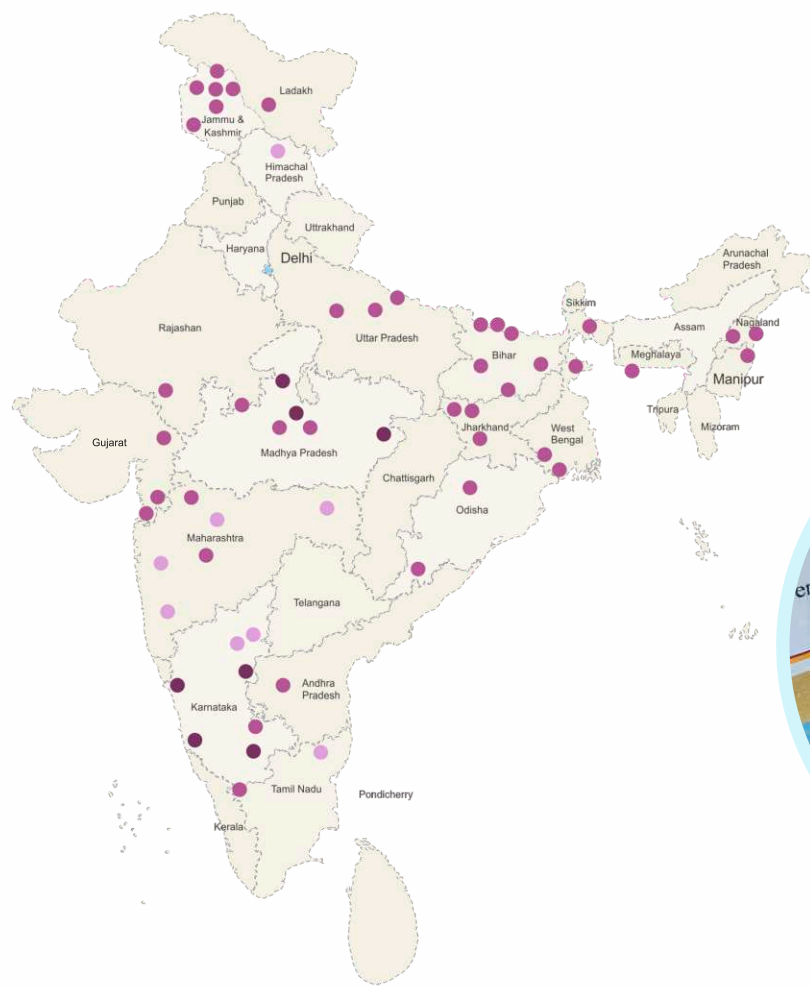
HCL Grant embodies the Foundation's pledge to transform rural India by strengthening ecosystems, owned and led by communities.

CASE STUDY



THE ONLY ALTERNATIVE IS TO 'BEE'

For many small and marginal farmers of India, struggling with structural and climate change induced food and economic insecurity, beekeeping offers multiple benefits such as income source and alternate livelihoods. Struggling to keep afloat during the pandemic, the beekeeping training came at an opportune time for Manubhai Pawar, a farmer from Gujarat.



80-85% uptick in the conversion of flowers to fruits, of his Mango and Papaya trees.



~120 Kgs increase in the bean harvest of individual farmers.

Delighted at the turn around, he is now relying on his bees to script a brighter future.

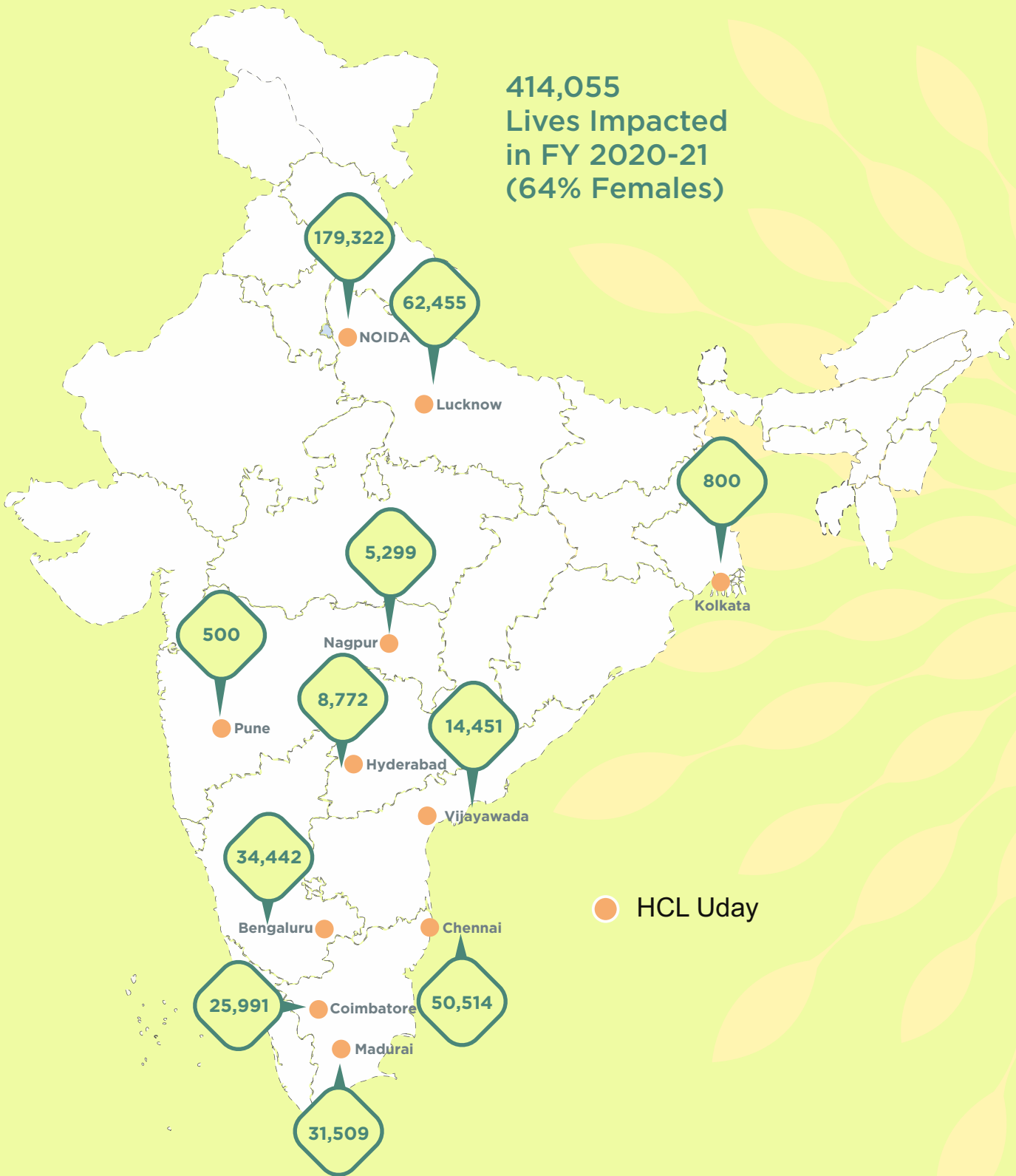
Defined by 3 C's, Uday is:

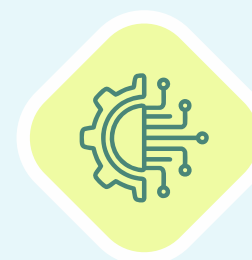

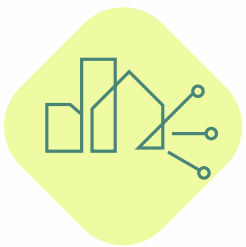

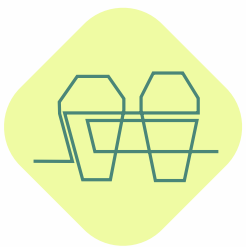
CLEAN NOIDA IMPLEMENTS THE FOLLOWING INITIATIVES:



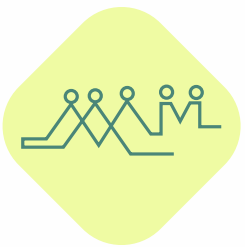
Model Urban Villages: Clean NOIDA has created an end-to-end sustainable solid waste management (SWM) system. Implemented in eight villages, it is deploying trained and sensitized personal ‘Green Friends’ who collect, transport and dispose waste in a systematic manner.



Chakachak* Villages: Prioritizing the role of cleanliness and hygiene in the well-being and good health of citizens, Clean NOIDA launched mass cleanliness drives in all 62 urban villages of Noida. Through sustained interactions, communities were encouraged to volunteer and ensure waste free environs in their villages.



Clean Sectors Initiative: To raise awareness, promote positive behavior and encourage segregation of waste at source, Clean NOIDA works closely with Resident Welfare Associations. Residents, domestic help and sanitation workers are sensitized on different facets of the issue.



Community Engagement Initiative: To build a cadre of dedicated volunteers, Clean NOIDA ran online and offline campaigns to encourage different stakeholders to engage with the cause. Reaching out to schools, colleges, RWAs, urban villages, market institutions and business houses, it seeds waste free appropriate behavior.

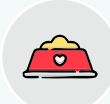
