



HCL's mobile and remote working solution selected by Wiltshire Police

HCL to design, implement and manage a new solution to free police officers from their desks, increase policing visibility and improve productivity

London – December xxx 2007 - HCL Technologies (HCL), the global IT and engineering services provider, today announced that it has been selected as the provider of a mobile and remote working solution to Wiltshire Police. Valued at 4 million USD, the partnership will last for five and a half years, including an initial six month implementation period.

Policing in the UK faces huge challenges, as it tries to balance ever expanding demand with a period of tightening financial constraints. Liberating officers from their desks is a key strand in Wiltshire Police's plans and HCL's mobile and remote working solution is seen as central to this. It's about enabling officers to do their work better and smarter, by cutting down unproductive time and giving them, at their fingertips, the information they need to combat crime and provide assistance to the public.

Through this solution HCL are helping Wiltshire transform policing operations. It isn't enough to give officers what they currently have, only out in the field. Success will only come when officers see streamlined processes and information flows that help them do more of what they joined the Service to do. This is why the HCL solution starts from the officer perspective, redesigns policing processes from start to finish and then creates a tool set and means of presentation that really works for the officer. What better way, for example, to help find a missing person than the ability, within a matter of seconds, to send officers a photograph together with an up-to-date log of all the associated intelligence?

The first of HCL's engagements with the UK public sector, this partnership is a milestone in HCL's growing presence in the UK market. Rajeev Sawhney, President Europe, HCL Technologies, commented on the partnership, "This is a significant award for HCL and one that we are particularly proud of. It demonstrates our commitment to local markets and the UK public sector."

The contract was awarded under the UK Government's Catalyst Specialist Solutions framework. This solution makes excellent business sense as well. Wiltshire Police expect to repay their entire capital investment through increased productivity within the first year. By streamlining processes, they also expect to be able to offset the ongoing costs of maintaining this technology. So taxpayers should not have to pay more for the benefits this solution brings. The only losers therefore should be the criminal fraternity.

Matt Bennion-Pedley, Wiltshire Police's Director of Finance, said: "It was HCL's business focus and collaborative approach that gave them the edge. We were looking for an innovative approach but also one that has to deliver results quickly, be easily scalable and adapt to continual changes in policing legislation and practice. It is still early days in the solution's development but we believe we have found a real winner. This augurs well not just for us but also for UK policing in general."

The solution will involve the creation of a Service Oriented Architecture (SOA) that is cost-effective both to maintain and develop, and can be easily replicated in other Forces or associated agencies. The solution is network and device independent and hence is not limited by the operational policing solutions within any Force.
